







Syllabus

- Instructor's contact information
 - Office location, office hours, email address, etc.
- Course descriptions
 - Overview of what will be covered in the course, learning objectives
- Course schedule
 - Readings, assignments
- Important dates
 - Deadlines, exam days, etc.
- Policies
 - Grading, attendance, late assignments, academic misconduct, Al use



U.S. Classroom Environment

Preferred Teaching Methods:

- Lecture
- Discussion in large and small groups
- Application of theory
 - · Case studies, group projects, etc.
 - Co-op, internships, etc.





U.S. Classroom Environment

Your Role as a Student:

- Active listening, taking notes, reading material
- Thinking critically about content

Academic Integrity & Plagiarism

UC Defines Plagiarism as:

- Submitting another's published or unpublished work as one's own without crediting the author
- Submitting **as one's own** original work **without reference** to the source of the material
- Submitting as one's own original work produced through unacknowledged collaboration with others
- Submitting one's own previously written work without modification and instructor permission.

Al in the Classroom

Review Course Syllabi

 Syllabi often contain vital information about course policies regarding the use of technology, including AI tools.

Check with Faculty Members

- Openly communicate with your instructors about the acceptability and appropriate use of AI and Generative AI tools in your coursework.
- Faculty members can provide clear guidance on how these tools may or may not fit into their learning objectives and evaluation criteria.

Understand Academic Integrity

 Remain cognizant of <u>UC's policies on academic integrity</u>. The responsible use of technology, including AI technology, should align with principles of honesty, fairness, and respect for the intellectual work of others.

English Language Support

Center for English as a Second Language (CESL)

 Academic unit that provides for-credit ESL courses to international graduate and undergraduate students at UC. Focused on reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills.

Professors may also use Zoom, a communications platform that allows users to connect with video, audio, phone, and chat.




Log into the Outlook web app with your UC username and password to access your email and calendar.




Bearcat Guardian is a safety app that allows you to turn your cell phone into a safety device.

iBearcatsGlobal is the system that you will use to fill out electronic forms (e-forms), set up appointments with UC International advisors and maintain your visa status in the United States.

The Bearcat Portal is your student information hub and self-service center for actions you need to take prior to attending Orientation and your first semester.

Catalyst is the University of Cincinnati student information system. This online resource and student portal is the entry point to your academic record, university billing, financial aid, and more.

Who in your academic program is authorized to approve your CPT request for an internship, capstone, etc.? When do you need to target landing an internship, capstone, etc.? Where does this fit into your graduation plan? Do you have flexibility for a program extension?

Employ a follow-up strategy in both networking and job searching








