	<ul> <li>Committee Comments:</li> <li>Question: is the current job market looking for these specialized degrees / credentials, why not call it "Computer Science" - CS is too broad, whereas these specialized sub - strands train experts and companies are looking for these specifically trained student</li> <li>Question: was a certificate considered vs the track - yes, but felt the MEng plus the track options would attract more students than just a standalone certificate</li> <li>Graduate School approved to move to Academic Committee</li> </ul>
