- The main question / concern that requires follow-up is whether or not there is a capstone experience. According to the Graduate Student Handbook, "Master's students who are not required to complete a thesis should consult their academic programs for the capstone experience required in their programs. In some programs, the final capstone event may be in the form of a comprehensive exam or research project; in others, the final evaluation may appropriately be a recital, performance, or exhibition." The council was unable to identify the Capstone experience for these students, and the program will need to address this
- Question: how do students in this online program receive the same support they would if they were on campus, in terms of mental health. The program will need to elaborate on how A&S serves as a bridge to the university provided resources and how a program director, faculty member, etc., guides a student to mental health resources

Committee Comments:

- As the certificate grows, please remain mindful of other units / colleges that could be involved as partners, to make this a truly interdisciplinary certificate (a point that was mentioned in discussion)
 A different name was suggested that may help students better
- A different name was suggested that may help students better understand what the certificate is, what the courses will focus on, and who should take this certificate, that being "Community Engaged Research for Health" – if not this name, then one that is similar to this that identifies the focus of the certificate a bit better
- As discussed in the meeting, since the bulk of the funding for CCST is from grant support, the Council would like college level commitment to offering the needed courses for the certificate, if the CCST grant funding is not renewed. If the certificate is no longer offered, then the courses leading to the certificate may also cease
